4: Tiger Leader & Parent Breakout

(Part 3 of Cub Leader-Specific Training) Covers the role of the Tiger Cub leader, purposes of the Tiger program, what a Tiger den leader does, how to plan and conduct a den meeting and "Go See It" activity, Tiger advancement, Tiger Cub behavior issues, and how to have fun with Tiger Cubs. Open to all Tiger Cub leaders and parents, not just to get trained.

5: Pack Events: Blue and Gold

Learn the secrets of staging a blue & gold banquet. Learn how to maximize fun, participation, promote Scouting values and positive competition. Get ideas to keep within the tightest of budgets and preserve your sanity!

6: Webelos: Community & Physical Groups

Great ideas on the following activity badges: citizen, communicator, family member, readyman, aquanaut, athlete, fitness & sportsman.

7: Cub Scout Knots & Knives

Learn how to introduce these important skills to Cub & Webelos Scouts.

8: Wolf & Bear Leader Breakout

(Part 3 of Cub Leader-Specific Training) The latest information and resources on what it takes to be a Wolf or Bear Cub Scout den leader. Presents the purposes of the Cub Scout program, what a Wolf/Bear Cub Scout leader does, how to plan and conduct a Wolf/Bear den meeting, Wolf/Bear advancement, Wolf/Bear Cub Scout behavior issues, and how to have fun with Wolf/Bear Cub Scouts. Open to all Wolf/Bear leaders, not just to get trained.

9: Campfire Skits & Songs & Puppetry

Take advantage of everyone's acting and singing ability. Identify resources to liven up any campfire or other Scouting occasion using showmanship, skits, stunts, songs and stories. Learn how simple props and costumes enhance performances. **Class may be held outdoors.**

10: Pack Meeting Entertainment

Pep up your pack meetings with audience participation, run-ons and applause. Learn the use of simple props, costumes, magic, lighting and music to create memorable ceremonies and a powerful pack meeting focusing on family fun.

11: Cub & Webelos Grub (Outdoors)

Hands-on cooking for fun anywhere with Cubs & Webelos. Get recipes and various indoor and outdoor cooking techniques and equipment. Please bring \$2.00 to add to the pot to help cover the extra cost of this class.

12: Cubmaster Breakout

(Part 4 of Cub Leader-Specific Training) Learn about your role in the pack as a Cubmaster, Assistant Cubmaster or prospective Cubmaster. This session shows what it takes to be a Cubmaster, including roles of the Cubmaster and assistant Cubmaster, the Cub Scout advancement program, the importance of pack program planning, planning a pack meeting, the Cubmaster Award, and how to succeed as a Cubmaster. Open to all CMs & ACMs, not just to get trained.

13: Safe Shooting

At the end of this two hour course, participants will have their two-year certification to participate as BB and Archery Rangemasters at Council Day Camps. This is a two session course.

14 Cub Scout Science and Magic

Come and discover all the fun that you can have as you explore science and magic with your cubs.

15: Pack Committee Breakout

(Part 4 of Cub Leader-Specific Training) This session shows what it takes to be a member of a Cub Scout pack committee. Objectives include defining the role of the pack committee, makeup and functions on the pack committee, people who support the pack committee, the pack planning process, how packs are funded, and where packs can get help. Open to all Pack Committee members, not just to get trained.

16: Webelos: Mental & Technology Groups

Great ideas on the following activity badges: artist, scholar, showman, traveler, craftsman, engineer, handyman and scientist.

17: Cub Scout Theme Crafts on a Budget

Crafts, projects, and all the rest of the fun stuff you do with your boys, on a budget. Come and get a years worth of ideas.

18: Webelos: Outdoor Group

Come and learn about great camping and outdoor activities for a Webelos den while using Leave No Trace principles. Includes great ideas on the following activity badges: outdoorsman, forester, naturalist and geologist.

19: Webelos Leader Breakout

(Part 3 of Cub Leader-Specific Training) Learn about your role in the Webelos den and how that affects the lives of boys. Includes purposes of the Webelos program, what a Webelos den leader does, how to plan and conduct a Webelos den meeting, Webelos advancement, Webelos behavior issues, and how to have fun with Webelos. Open to all Webelos leaders, not just to get trained.

20: BALOO

This is an all day course that will get you the training you need to take your Cub Scouts on Pack overnights. Come prepared to learn all you need to know to successfully organize and safely camp with Cub Scouts.

21: Scoutmaster & Assistant Scoutmaster Specific Training

(All day Sessions 1-4) This leader specific training is for Scoutmasters, Asst. Scoutmasters & interested parents. Learn how a "boy-led" troop operates. Have confidence managing the Scoutmaster role and learning the resources available to ensure success.

22: Great Eagle Court of Honor

This course reviews several different ceremony possibilities as well as giving helpful tips such as how to get press releases and dignitaries to send letters to your Eagle Scouts

23: Wilderness 1st Aid and Risk Management

This class will focus on safety conducting camping and hiking trips with a Scouting unit. topics will include planning, equipment, weather related issues (avalanche, lightning, heat and cold, swift water). We will discuss resources available for more advanced training in wilderness first responder, avalanche, rock and ice climbing, search and rescue.

24: High Adventure: What We've Done

Come and learn from others who have organized great High Adventure Activities. This class may also include question and answers as well as opportunities to share your experiences.

25: Improve Patrol Leader's Council/Maximize Youth Leadership:

How to help Patrol Leaders Council be effective and capitalize on the leadership potential in your Scout-led Troop. Tips for parents, committee and Scoutmasters.

26: GPS

One hour class, Learn how to use your GPS to navigate in the backcountry, using a map, compass and GPS. To get the most out of this 2 part session, bring a compass and a GPS for classroom instruction and hands on outside practice. BEFORE the seminar you MUST set up your GPS unit to the following preferences. 1) Set the heading system to DEGRES 2) Set the North Preference to Magnetic. 3) Set the DATUM to WGS 84 4) Set distance to Statute Miles

27: Troop Planning

Learn how to help your Boys plan a full year of activities.

28: Scoutmaster Conference and Board of Review

(How to get the most out of them and keep the boys motivate) How to effectively conduct a SM Conference and Board of Review. Learn counseling strategies and techniques to assist Scouts on the advancement trail.

29: How to Guide Eagle Project Selection/How to Sink and Eagle Before He Flies

Come get the nuts and bolts of the Eagle projects. The course will cover suggestions on where to look, details of planning, project write up & approval, soliciting donations, as well as guiding the young men through the paperwork needed to earn their Eagle.

30: Campfire Songs and Skits (Above and beyond Cub Scouts)

Take advantage of everyone's acting and singing ability. Identify resources to liven up any campfire or other Scouting occasion using showmanship, skits, stunts, songs and stories. Learn how simple props and costumes enhance performances. Class may be held outdoors.

31: Dutch Oven Cooking Basics

LNT is an outdoor ethics program that teaches techniques visitors can use to help reduce evidence of their presence in the back country. Attendees will be trained to the LNT awareness level. They will learn the 7 principles of LNT, through lecture, discussion, and hands on games.

Create balanced menus and inexpensive backcountry meals. Learn to dehydrate food, determine quantities, repackaging, storage and preparation. Sample menus will be presented for weekend and week long outings.
