## Who Can Attend?

Boy Scouts and Varsity Scouts must be at least First Class Scouts. They must have completed the sixth grade or be at least 12 years of age by July 1, 2010, but not have reached their 18th birthday by August 4, 2010. All Scouts must participate in a pre-jamboree training, complete the Jamboree Personal Health & Medical Record and be approved by your unit leader and the council Jamboree Committee.
