Klondike Derby 2010 General Information

1. All Scouts and adults must be properly clothed for stormy weather. Prepare for rain, snow and cold temperatures. **Please no Athletic shoes on the course!!** All Scouts should have completed winter camping training if they are camping outside overnight. Scoutmasters may reserve lodging for troop members in advance at no extra charge.
2. Bring your Patrol's **FIRST AID KIT** and have it secured to your sled.
3. The Patrol Leader and Scoutmaster may check in at Klondike Headquarters on Friday after 1:00pm, register and pay if necessary. Saturday check in will start at 8:00am with the Derby events starting at 9:00am. Units must check in before starting the Derby. Awards and closing flag ceremony at 2:45pm.
4. The campsite inspection team will make an effort to inspect every tent or snow shelter to ensure that **everyone** sleeps on a **closed cell foam insulation pad**. Inspection criteria will be based on good camping practices including shelter construction, food and water storage, and general overall neatness. Campsite inspection will not be scored this year.
5. Each patrol must build a sled to compete on the Yukon trail. You can find sled designs at http://www.scoutdocs.ca/Klondike/Klondike_sled_plans. The plans are suggested design only. You can vary from the design but stay close to the overall size in the suggested design.
6. Each sled must be equipped with a container (box, bag or tarp) to transport cook stove, food, first aid kit, 10' x 12' (or larger) tarp and twine for cooking shelter, and the **TEN ESSENTIALS**. Each sled also needs a water-proof pouch to hold a 8 1/2" x 11" score sheet. Please note that each sled needs to have a patrol name plate on each side of their sled. Points will be awarded for all of the above.
7. Each patrol is expected to bring and prepare food for all meals. This includes eating a hot lunch on the trail. The main dish should be heated with a stove (Example: soup, chilli, etc.). A hot lunch is required and will be scored as an event.
8. The cost is \$12 per Scout and \$12 per adult registering and paying by January 22nd. You can register and pay on Friday evening February 19th (late fees will apply).
9. Each patrol must have 4 Scouts but no more than 6 Scouts. Please note: It is expected that all adults assist the Venture Crews staffing the events during the Derby. If you prefer to go along and help with one of your patrols, points will be deducted from the patrol's score. This activity is for Scouts to participate in, and we need all the adults that attend to lend a hand. Thank you!

YUKON TRAIL EVENTS

Fire Building

Patrols will have to build a fire using matches or lighter but must use only wood found on the Yukon trail. They will be score on how long it takes them to gather and build a fire high enough to burn through twine 16" high.

Canyon Traverse

Patrol will pass all members over a ¾" rope suspended above the ground between two trees to simulate a canyon. The rope will span approximately 30 feet. All equipment will be provided. This is a timed event. Extra points will be awarded for passing the sled and all gear.

Rope Throw and Log Lift

One patrol member will throw a 50' rope over a crossarm. A second patrol member will tie a timber hitch and half hitch around a log. A third patrol member will tie off the other end of the rope using a clove hitch; the patrol will hoist the log off the ground using the rope and the fourth patrol member will shorten the rope using a sheepshank. All equipment will be provided. This is a timed event to test knot skills and teamwork.

Rifle Shooting

Each patrol will shoot fifty rounds and the total score will be based on accuracy. All equipment will be provided.

Lunch

Patrols will construct a cooking shelter with their own tarp and twine, and prepare a hot lunch. This will be a scored event. Each patrol will provide food and cooking utensils.

First Aid

Patrol will describe symptoms and demonstrate treatment for two of the following selected at random:

Head trauma Dehydration Heart Attack Severe Laceration/Artery

Hypothermia Frostbite/Snow Blindness Broken bones

Patrols will provide equipment for treatment. A CPR dummy will be supplied.

Orienteering

All patrol members will be required to follow a course using directions given. Patrols will be required to use their own compass and true north directions will be given and declination will be 18°. This is a timed event.

Archery Range

Patrols will shoot at targets and be scored on accuracy. Equipment will be provided.

Snow Shoe Relay

Patrol members will be required to wear snowshoes and complete a relay course. This is a timed event. Snowshoes will be available or use your own.
